Investment Programme 2018

During 2018/19 we propose to invest a further £6M into our housing stock, by completing a number of external enveloping projects, as well internal WHQS improvement work.

External Enveloping programme

We are continuing to invest in a large number of properties over the next 12 months. As well as improvements to the housing stock, we also intend to complete a number of environmental improvements which will aim to regenerate entire estates. The improvements works will include the following elements:

- Replacements roofs
- External wall repairs including rendering and dashing works
- External roofline replacements including rainwater goods
- Replacement porches and canopies
- Replacement boundary fences & gates
- Replacement pathways
- Upgraded street lighting
- Highway and traffic calming improvements

The works are being completed as part of a three year improvement programme which to date has successfully improved in excess of 150 properties.

During 2018/19 we intend to complete similar improvements in the following areas:

42 Properties in Rhyl

23 Properties in Ruthin

41 Properties in Llangollen

We will also start survey work in Denbigh during 2018/19 to identify major repairs to a number of properties which will form part of our 2019/20 programme of works.

To supplement our major external work programmes, we will also be upgrading a number of other properties, with replacement fascias, soffits and gutters, as well as a programme of window and external porch replacements.





Internal Refurbishments

We have identified 70 properties in Rhyl which will be improved internally during 2018. The work will include replacement kitchens, bathrooms and electrical upgrades. A number of similar improvement programmes will be completed over the coming years, to ensure the standard is maintained year on year.

Heating Improvements

As part of our commitment to ensure our homes are as energy efficient as possible, we intend to upgrade a further 200 gas combination boilers during 2018/19. The boilers will replace our older type boilers with more efficient and reliable 'A' rated condensing type appliances. We also intend to complete a small pilot scheme to renew a number of Economy 7 systems within the stock with a more efficient electric heating system. A larger programme of upgrades will then be considered in the future for a number of properties which are off the gas network.

Bro Havard Estate Improvement

In our Autumn edition, we announced an exciting £1.2m environmental improvement project in St Asaph. We are now several months into the project and are already seeing a number of improvements being delivered in the community, including highways and footpath reconstruction and environmental landscaping. Phases 1 & 2 of the project are due to be completed by this Autumn and areas will benefit from better parking, traffic calming measures and open area landscaping for the community to enjoy.

As the project has gone so well, we are able to extend the works to phase 3, which includes improvements to highways and footpaths for the remainder of Heol Clwyd East and Llwyn Elwy North, allowing for the whole area to be improved. The soft landscaping and tree planting will take place from September, with the whole area really seeing the benefit next spring.

Community Spotlight – Cysgodfa Community Centre, Denbigh

Cysgodfa is made up of 36 flats and a community centre which is open to residents and people from the wider community in Denbigh.



Over the years, the Centre has seen many activities including VE Day celebrations, race and quiz nights, Christmas parties, birthday parties, bingo, lunch and breakfast clubs, multicultural nights and many more.

We have a media suite comprising of computers, laptops, iPads, printer and various other equipment. Arrangements can be made for people to access the suite and help is available to those who are not sure about the internet.

Currently, we host a number of activities and events for everyone to come along to, including:

Whist:

Whist enthusiasts hold whist drives:

- every Friday night at 7.30pm
- on the first Wednesday of every month and
- on the 5th Thursday of the month.

They are always looking for new players and make everyone welcome so why not come along and give it a try?

Stroke Club:

On Tuesday mornings the Stroke Club offers activities suited to those who have had a stroke and on occasion have invited guest speakers. The Club is an ideal opportunity to make new friends, socialise and enjoy the various leisure activities that are available.

Talking Points:

Talking Points is a way for people to find out the type of help available to support their health and well-being in their local area. There is a session at Cysgodfa every other Wednesday morning, where you can have a conversation about what is important to you.

Age Connects:

Age Connects specialise in supporting people aged 50+, whilst offering a variety of ways of helping adults of all ages. They attend the Centre every six weeks with various organizations such as Citizen's Advice, Fire Service, Red Cross and Solicitors offering advice and help to those who attend.

Denbigh Safety Group:

Denbigh Safety Group meet on the last Wednesday of the month at 7.15 pm, where a representative from Denbighshire County Council, North Wales Police, Grŵp Cynefin, Denbigh Town and County Councillors come along to chat to residents and local people about accessing their services and what they can do to make communities feel safer.

Local school children:

The children at Ysgol y Parc have been coming to 'Create' on a Thursday afternoon to enjoy art work with the residents of Cysgodfa and others from the community. It has been great fun and enjoyed by everyone who has come along.

Coming Soon:

Armchair aerobics and Denbigh Walk & Talk will be starting soon and all are welcome.

Money saving tips from one of our tenants

Why not switch provider?

In the last few years, money has become tighter for everyone with our wages or pensions not going as far as they have in the past. However there is something we can all do to save money and that is switch.

Some banks are offering to pay you to switch, but first you need to check out which is the best for you. I have saved a lot of money over the past couple of years switching my electric company and car insurance company. It is surprising the range of costs for the same product, but you have to check that the company offers everything you need and want.

It costs nothing to switch, just go on to web sites such as Compare the Market, Confused.com, Go Compare and other sites found on the Internet.

Log on to a site, put in your details and press a button. Choose the company you want and get a quote. Once you have decided that company is the one for you, just press switch and they will do everything for you. You don't even have to leave your chair.

If you change your bank account your new bank will transfer all Direct Debits etc. Your wages will automatically go into your new account and the new bank will send your card etc straight away. No hassle and nothing for you to do. With the electric and gas all you have to do is send a final reading. That is it!

The car insurance companies do everything for you so simple and easy.

If you do not have a computer, ask someone to do it for you or call in to a community centre or library where someone will be happy to help.



Universal Credit and what it means for you



As of the 11th April 2018, Universal Credit has been implemented in Denbighshire. This means if you are making a new claim, you will need to apply for Universal Credit. You can make a claim for Universal Credit if you are on a low income or unemployed.

You will also be affected if you receive the following benefits:

- Income support
- Income based Job Seekers Allowance (JSA)
- Income related Employment Support Allowance (ESA)
- Child Tax Credit
- Working Tax Credit
- Housing Benefit

If you are already claiming these benefits or tax credits you don't need to do anything now. The Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) will get in touch with you before there are any changes to your benefits or tax credits.

If you start receiving Universal Credit, then this will replace any of these benefits or tax credits. If you are getting tax credits you can still choose to apply for Universal Credit, depending on your circumstances, but you can't receive both.

Housing Benefit:

Currently if you receive Housing Benefit, this is paid directly to Denbighshire Housing on your behalf to assist with your rent. Under Universal Credit this will be paid directly to you, alongside your other benefits in one monthly household payment. It will be your responsibility to ensure your rent is paid monthly onto your rent account.

If your circumstances change:

If you receive these benefits or tax credits and your circumstances change, it may mean that you will no longer be able to get those benefits or tax credits. You will need to make a new claim for Universal Credit instead.

Universal Credit is a fully digital online service, which means you will need to have access to the internet so you can apply online. If you don't have access to the internet at home, pop along to your nearest library.

Housing developments

In our last newsletter, we shared the news that we would be starting to build new Council homes for the first time in over 25 years.

We've just had planning permission for our first development, which will be four apartments on the site of the old Bodnant school canteen in Caradoc Road in Prestatyn. We were pleased to secure Innovative Grant funding from Welsh Government for this project.

Work has recently started on clearing the existing building from the site and we'll be starting work on building the new apartments later in the Summer.

Very soon a planning application will also be going in for a development of new homes to replace the Pennant Flats in Denbigh and we'll be starting work on converting a property we've bought in Brighton Road in Rhyl, which will provide three new apartments.

This is just the first development in our programme of building 170 new Council homes throughout the County over the next four years.



Rhyl Task Team makes a difference to the local community

A group of volunteers have rejuvenated a community garden in Rhyl and developed new skills in the process.

Volunteers, all aged over 25, from Groundwork North Wales' Task Team added two benches, laid a new pathway and built four wooden raised planters at the garden on Rhydwen Drive. Task Team is a new initiative supported by the European Social Fund through the Welsh Government Innovation Fund, for people over 25 years old living in a Community for Work cluster. Groundwork North Wales ran the project along with their partner, Communities at Work.

In January, volunteers showcased their achievements and hard work at The Phoenix Centre on Rhydwen Drive, which is a centre run by volunteers made up of local members of the community.

The volunteers who signed up for Task Team put in a vast number of hours into the 12 week project, spending two days a week learning new skills on an accredited course, as well as tackling a practical project and making a huge difference to the local community by regenerating the community garden and relaxation area.

The project has proven a real success, with the volunteers gaining in confidence, learning new skills and working as part of a prosperous team, resulting in a variety of positive outcomes for the members of the Task Team.

Gary Bruffell, Green Skills Co-ordinator at Groundwork North Wales said: ***"I'm really proud of everyone involved in the project; they've all developed new skills and gained a lot of confidence which will only enhance their prospects of improving their chances in life and using the new skills they have learnt."***

Councillor Tony Thomas, Denbighshire's lead member for Housing, Regulation and the Environment, said: ***"The Council was delighted to be involved in such a great project by providing the garden."***

"This project has not only helped participants gain new skills, but it has provided a real benefit to the local community as well. As a Council we would like to congratulate everyone involved."

At this time of year, we are all out hopefully enjoying the Summer weather and our gardens. We have put together some tips to keep your garden looking good throughout the Summer months. If you would like any more information check out the advice section on the RHS website www.rhs.org.uk

Our top 5 tips to keep your garden looking good this summer

June

1. Keep weeds under control
2. Tie in climbing plants
3. Plant out Summer bedding
4. Plant up and position containers and hanging baskets
5. Reseed patchy areas in lawns

July

1. Water containers and hanging baskets during dry spells - in the evening is best.
2. Deadhead bedding plants and perennials
3. Continue to keep weeds under control
4. Keep mowing your lawn, at least once a week
5. Growing your own tomatoes? Remove the side shoots to promote better growth

August

1. Keep container plants well-watered
2. Deadhead roses and prune climbing roses
3. Continue to deadhead flowering bedding plants and perennials.
4. Collect seeds from your favourite plants to sow next year
5. Start to harvest spring sown vegetables

STAR Survey - Survey of Tenants and Residents

The past 18 months has seen some significant changes for Denbighshire Housing. We want to continue to raise our standards to the highest possible level and we need to work with you to achieve this.

This Autumn we will be carrying out our third STAR survey. In 2016-17, we asked you 7 core questions specific to properties. These covered quality of home, value for money with rents and service charges, your neighbourhood as a place to live, how we listen to you and act upon what you said and the overall service we provide.

In addition to this, we asked some general questions about our reputation as a housing Service, priorities, trust, staff, digital access, communication and health and wellbeing

to give us a better insight in to how we can improve in these areas.

Here is a summary of what you said:



3,344

surveys were mailed out.

Community Development update

As part of our commitment to our communities, our community development team have been working with tenants to develop projects in your neighbourhoods, support communities to get together, organise events and projects for themselves.

What we have been up to?

In the past year we have worked on and supported a number activities and projects, including:

- Working on our **Community Development and Tenant Engagement** Strategy to develop a detailed action plan for us to work towards over the next 3 years. DTARF have also been involved by reviewing the draft plans and will sign off the final copy.
- **Shark Bites** project working jointly with TAPE to create a short film showing the risks of using loan sharks to bridge any financial worries you may have.



- **Morfa Gateway Project** in Prestatyn is a new exciting joint project with Artisans Collective, Denbighshire Housing, Countryside Services, North Wales Police, Healthy Prestatyn Iach, Groundworks and Keep Wales Tidy. The project has cleared the overgrown space opposite the Coed Y Morfa car park and created a new community nature space where the community can come and help in the garden or sit and relax. The group meet every Thursday 10 – 2pm and anyone from the community can come along and volunteer. For more information please visit: @morfagatewayprestatyn on Facebook.
- **Health & Wellbeing** - we have been working with other agencies and the Community Wellbeing team to help set up a number of Social Prescribing projects across the South of the County which includes; Armchair Exercises, Walk and Talk with Age Connect and Clwb Creu, integrational

Arts project with Denbighshire Community Wellbeing and Grŵp Cynefin. If you are part of a community group and wish to have something like this in your community hub then please contact your Community Development Officer.

- **Friends of Pengwern** – The community of Pengwern have been working closely with DCC Housing, OPUS, Grŵp Cynefin, North Wales Police, Severn Wye and a range of community based organisations.
